“This is a very heartfelt review from a daughter who had a Dad that abused drugs most of his life and surely through all of mine. Although he spent time making sure I knew my cousins, aunts and uncles and my Grandma Dink, (one of my favorite people on the planet) but sadly she unexpectedly passed away a few years ago. Our whole family still feels that loss. After Grandma Dink passed, Daddy, I think went into deep depression, I still cry whenever I mention this... I thought the next thing I'd hear from my aunts would be that they found him dead in a ditch somewhere.

Until, the MIRACLE, well in my mind and I am sure my daddy feels the same way. When Kay called me, my first thought was, Oh please let him be OK, please let me be OK! She then proceeded to tell me my Daddy had entered into a program to help him get sober and get his life right. That program was Alamance Rescue Mission, a special wonderful mission! The Rescue Mission saved my Daddy's life. He is the same ole cut up, always asking if I need anything, and asking about his only grand daughter. I try to write him at least 3 times a month and I send him birthday plants to care for. Giving him the job in the kitchen overseeing the food box distribution has given him a sense of pride and fulfillment. When I visit him now he is happier than he ever was doing drugs and alcohol. He has been clean for 7 years now. His relationship with God and his feeling of being needed at the mission has been what has changed his life and mine. Thank you Alamance Rescue Mission from the bottom of my heart for all you have done to help my Dad. Not all Angels wear wings!”



Jerome has been involved with our Food box distribution for over 6 years now. We have several Food Lions that donate to us on a daily basis. Last Thursday we had the manager of one of our Food Lions visit with several employees from his store to actively help give out the Food Boxes. It was a blessing to us that, in addition to their contributions of food to help the community, they went the extra mile to be onsite to help distribute the boxes to families in need. They wanted to have a hands on experience of seeing the faces of the people that receive the much needed food.

As most of you know we give out up to 40 food boxes to 40 families in need every week. Along with the food there is always a Gospel Tract in the box. This is just another way Piedmont Rescue Mission shares the Gospel on a daily basis. We know that while the food is needed the Bread of Life is what is **most** needed. God has blessed us through this ministry. Because of the connection with Second Harvest Food Bank and our grocery store partners there is very little cost to us.
