First of all, let me apologize for this month's letter being so late. We have entered into 2021 with our schedule running full force! We realize that we need to concentrate even more this year sharing the gospel to souls in need. The covid-19 virus has slowed down so many aspects of the ministry, but Lord willing and with your help we intend to get things back up and running on an even greater scale than in the past.

The Christmas Event seemed to be a success even though it was a lot different than in past years. God allowed us to minister to approximately 500 people with a hot meal, 209 toys to the children, 4 boxes of food to each family and 100 bikes to the children. Along with all these gifts the gospel was given out even though we were not able to hold our church services and children's story time.

William Green, one of our supervisors in the men's division is still not at 100% after his fight with covid. The effects of the covid-19 virus have been very hard on him. He is having issues with his diabetes and has been put on dialysis 3 times a week. Please pray for him and pray for the men who have stepped up to help fill in the gap while he is gone. We are praying he will be able to return to us, but as of now we do not know what will happen.

The pregnancy services has opened back up to clients coming back in for classes. The first weeks in January we have not had a lot of new clients calling for appointments but we feel it will pick back up as the virus becomes less of an issue. Please pray for the counselors in the office and the ladies who they minister to.

Last but not least, the Family Shelter. I have decided to dedicate most of my time this year to the shelter. So far, we have contracted someone to dig up the concrete for the plumbing for the new bathrooms, we have acquired the windows needed for the bedrooms and have someone who has agreed to help us cut the holes in the building to install them, we are also finishing up all the framing that needs to be done for the rooms. We need volunteers to come out and help as things get underway. If you would like to have a volunteer group come out, call 336-229-6995 and ask for Tammy Honeycutt.

Last year was a trying year for all of us. Hopefully as the things settle down, this year will be much better. We are trusting God to take us through the year and help us with all He has for us to do. We appreciate all you all have done to help us get through this tough year and pray you will continue to support us with your prayers and finances in 2021.
