“But Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart.” Luke 2:19



“Ponder: To weigh in the mind .To think about. To think or consider especially quietly, soberly, and deeply.”

When we read the definitions of the word ponder it brings on such a greater meaning to the word. Mary pondered in her heart the news that the angel had just brought to her.
