## Update on Journey Home Women and Children's Ministry



The city has approved the sprinkler system plans, and installation is scheduled to begin this month. Please pray that the work goes smoothly and without any issues. This month, someone broke into the shelter by breaking a window. To prevent further damage, we had to board up all the windows and doors. When we returned to continue working on the fencing, we found that someone had tried to pry the boards off again. It does not appear

that they got inside the building, but we now have additional costs to re-board and secure everything more strongly. The cost is about \$2,000. The broken window will need to be fully replaced, and we will not know what else may need repairs until the boards are removed. Please pray for protection from those who want to harm this ministry before it is even up and running.

In addition, our storage building at the mission has been broken into twice. The first time, a weed eater and blower used for yard work at the mission and Journey Home Shelter were stolen. The second time, a chainsaw that our maintenance man had been using to trim trees around the property was taken. We secured the building after both incidents, and after the second break-in, we added locks and a chain across the door. This has been very disheartening for us. The repairs and replacement costs take money away from ministry needs. Please pray that the mission properties will be protected from those who would try to cause harm.
